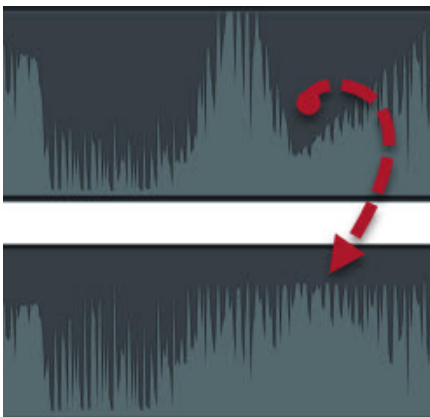

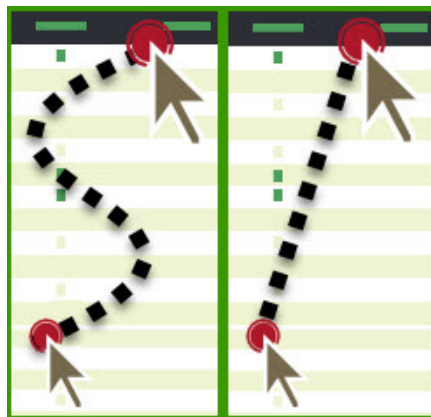
What's New in Camtasia 2019?

Camtasia 2019 continues to be the industry-leading software for easily creating videos that instruct and explain.


- Ensure that all video projects sound good with the new option to auto-normalize loudness across audio tracks
